General Military Course: Freshmen (AS 100) and Sophomore Years (AS 200)

- Competitive for Enrollment Allocation to Junior Year
 - National ranking (50% class ranking / 50% GPA, standardized test scores, fitness test scores)
 - Classified as technical (enrg majors or hard sciences) or non-technical; higher selection for technical majors
 - No AFROTC or AF service commitment (except contracted after AS 200 year)

Professional Officer Course: Junior (AS 300) and Senior (AS 400)

- Selected for continuance during AS 200 year and successfully completed 5-wk field training
- Contracted to AF prior to AS 300 year; stipend starts for non-scholarship cadets; if contract terms aren't fulfilled, the cadet is subject to release, recoupment of monies given, or 2-yr active duty service

Scholarship not required (approx. 33-35% on scholarship)

- In-college scholarship possibilities (min GPA / test scores)
 - o Express (critical tech majors) and technical majors; highly likely for AS 100 and AS 200;
 - o Non-technical: highly competitive nationally; primarily to AS 200
 - o Leadership: Commander's choice (Detachment ranking = high); AS 200 likely / AS 100 possibility
- Scholarship = Tuition (full/partial), \$900 textbook allowance, monthly stipend
 - o High School Scholarship winners contract freshmen year; may drop program prior to start of AS 200 year
 - o If contract broken, the cadet is subject to release, recoupment of any monies given, or 2-yr active duty service

Job Selection:

- Rated categories (i.e. "the fliers") – spring of AS 300 year; non-rated categories (i.e. all others) – fall of AS 400 year
- Special selections
 - Special Operations / Air Liaison Officer
 - AF Office of Special Investigation
 - Medical school (doctor / dentist @ approx 20 / yr)
 - Graduate school (engineers or acquisition engineers)
- Commission at graduation and called to active duty within 1 yr
 - 4 yr commitment for most; rated: up to 10 yr commitment after pilot training
 - Starting salary: base pay + subsistence + housing (www.dfas.mil)
